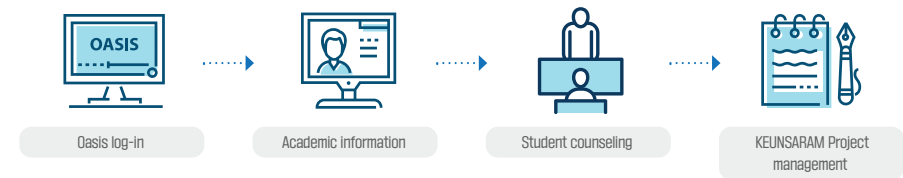
What is the KEUNSARAM Project?

KEUNSARAM Career Belt by Grade



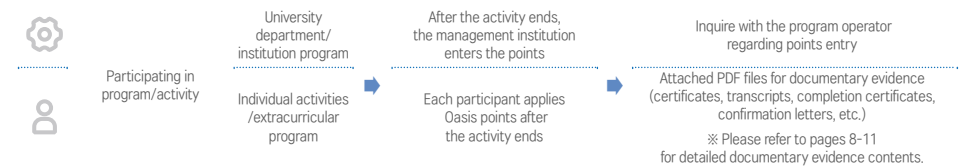

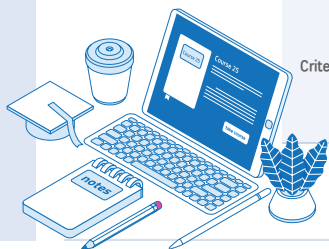

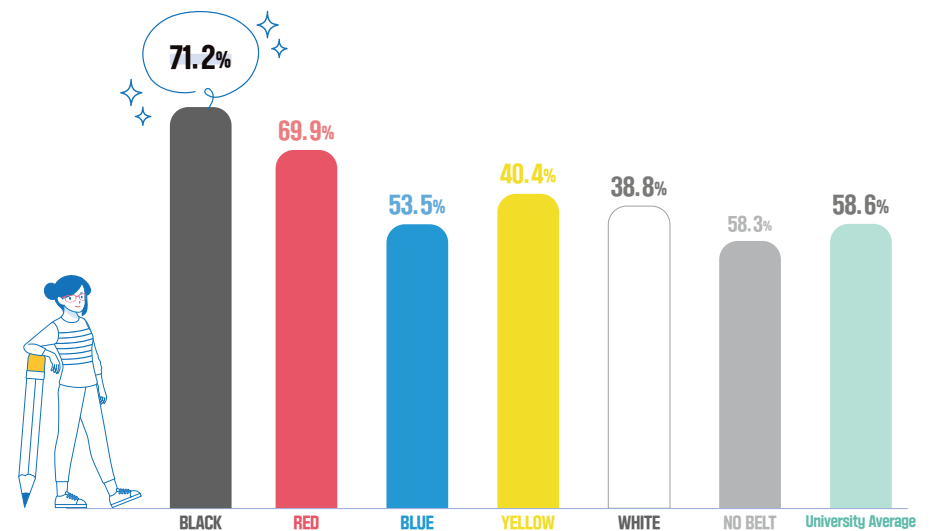

FAQ

Q1. How can I acquire a KEUNSARAM belt?

When all the required and elective courses for each belt level, including the specified points, are completed, the belt will be automatically certified in the Oasis system. Grade belts are available gradually starting from the white belt, so the previous belt must be completed for the next level belt to be processed. Therefore, if activities for the belt are completed, lower grade students can acquire higher belts early or higher grade students can acquire lower grade belts. (Note) Not all students who have earned a belt are selected as scholarship recipients. Please be sure to check the separate notice for each semester regarding the scholarship selection criteria.

Q2. Can students obtain the ORANGE (Practical Employment) BELT without completing the previous belt levels?

Yes. Fourth-year students are allowed to enter the program midway. Even if they have not completed the previous belt levels, they may still be selected as scholarship recipients if they complete all ORANGE (Practical Employment) BELT requirements. However, the ORANGE BELT scholarship cannot be awarded simultaneously with the RED BELT scholarship. If a student qualifies for both, only one scholarship (the one with the more favorable benefit) will be awarded.

Q3. How can I earn points?

For on-campus activities, please inquire with the department in charge of the activity to confirm the status of point entry. For off-campus activities or on-campus activities that are not uniformly entered by the department, please prepare activity evidence first. Then, go to the Oasis KEUNSARAM Project Management → Point Application/Approval, enter the point history, details, activity area, etc. (please attach the prepared evidence), and apply for points.

Q4. When will the approval for Oasis point application be granted?

The requested points are processed individually by the department in charge of each activity, and approval is typically granted within 2 weeks after the application. If you require approval within a specific time such as a scholarship selection period, it is recommended to apply at least 1 week in advance.

Q5. Are activities before admission recognized for incoming freshmen?

The KEUNSARAM Project is a program that manages experiences during university life, and only activities after admission to the university are recognized. However, starting from freshmen who entered in 2020, Korean history, Chinese characters, and foreign language scores (limited to regular tests) obtained from September of the year before admission to February of the admission year are eligible for double points.

Q6. How can transfer students participate?

Transfer students are subject to the same rules for obtaining belts and points as regular students. Evidence of activities from previous universities is accepted when submitted, but documents (such as academic transcripts or enrollment certificates) proving the activities during the entire enrollment period at the previous university must be submitted for point approval.

Q7. How can I inquire about the Reading Certification Program?

The Education Innovation Headquarters is responsible for approving points for the Reading Certification Program and reading reflection essays. For any inquiries regarding the Reading Certification Program and point approval, please contact the Education Innovation Headquarters.
