The 2026 Joint International Conference, themed “Origins, Resources, and Solidarity: Restoring Identity and Social Integration,” aims to reexamine the historical exchanges between Korea and Vietnam, as well as the cultural, linguistic, and social relationships that have emerged from these interactions. Through this initiative, the conference seeks to broaden the horizons of connection and cooperation between the two countries.

Relations between Korea and Vietnam have developed numerous points of intersection through labor migration and international marriages, cooperation in education and industry, as well as the mutual influence between K-culture and Vietnamese popular culture. The traces of these exchanges have been preserved in various forms of documentation and memories connected to individuals and local communities. The collection, systematization, and organized sharing of such materials and memories are essential not only for shaping the identities of citizens in both countries, but also for fostering mutual understanding and establishing a foundation for social inclusion that transcends experiences of discrimination and exclusion.

In particular, as both Korea and Vietnam undergo rapid industrialization, urbanization, and large-scale international migration, the two countries are facing the shared task of rediscovering and reconstructing their “origins.” In this process,

language serves as a central medium that connects people across generations and national boundaries. Through language, it becomes possible to identify the processes of identity restoration among individuals and communities, as well as the self-awareness of Korean–Vietnamese migrants and second- and third-generation descendants who have been shaped within diverse cultural spaces. On this basis, the conference seeks to explore the notion of “origins” through the accumulated resources embedded in the languages and cultures of both countries, while also seeking models of coexistence and symbiosis grounded in the principles of social inclusion.

Furthermore, in today’s global context—where the protection of vulnerable groups and respect for cultural diversity are increasingly emphasized—this international conference is expected to serve as a practical forum for proposing policy recommendations and developing feasible models for implementation.

In response to these practical demands, the 2026 Joint International Conference, themed **“Origins, Resources, and Solidarity: Restoring Identity and Social Integration,”** is organized with the aim of creating an academic forum where researchers, lecturers, and educational administrators can exchange ideas, share experiences, and propose practical solutions. By reconstructing the past and present of both countries through documentary, linguistic, and cultural practices, the conference seeks to produce and disseminate valuable memories and knowledge for future generations, while also proposing a new global model of inclusion and solidarity.

On this basis, the two countries can work together to build and shape a shared future as partners, thereby contributing to the establishment of a more just and sustainable international order.

- History and Memory: The Multilayered Roots of Korea–Vietnam Relations
- Documentation and Archives: Methods of Preserving Records within Diverse Communities
- Language and Education: Communication and Identity Across Generations
- Cultural Representation and Media: Images of One Another
- Social Inclusion and Rights: Policies, Institutions, and Practices

- Community and Solidarity: Toward New Models of Coexistence and Symbiosis

- Strictly follow the attached template (JIC template 2026.docx) and write the abstract in English.
- Ensure the abstract is complete from introduction to conclusion.
- Papers should be prepared on A4-sized paper and should be prepared within 5–6 pages (excluding references and appendices).
- Include all authors' email addresses in the affiliation section, as specified in the template.

3.2 Submission Schedule

- Deadline for paper submission: **July 15, 2026**
- Notification of paper review results: **August 3, 2026**
